
### Day 5: 15 March 2020 Hobart

In 1830 Governor Arthur chose beautiful Port Arthur on the Tasman Peninsula as the ideal place to confine prisoners who had committed further crimes in the colony. It was a 'natural penitentiary' – the peninsula is connected to the mainland by Eaglehawk Neck, a strip of land less than 100m wide, guarded back in the day by ferocious guard dogs making the place seemingly escape –proof. An open-air museum with huge penitentiary, the remaining shell of the Convict Church, and





solitary confinement cells, portentously, Port Arthur is the best -preserved convict site in Australia. Consider an optional tour at Port Arthur. It's enormously worthwhile.

### Day 7: 17 March 2020 Burnie

Founded in 1827, vibrant Burnie is a pleasant port of call with galleries, parks, beautiful beaches, gardens, restaurants and cafes. With sparkling water and the best milk in the world for cheese making, it's no wonder Burnie is a purveyor of whiskey and cheeses.
